<p>Coverage Roster:</p> <p>Morning weekend work required.</p>	<p>Ward responsibilities/workload:</p> <p>GEM – 24 beds, junior staff comprises one AT, one RMO and one BPT. AT supervises the BPT/RMO.</p> <p>ACE – 6 beds, one AT and one RMO. AT supervises the RMO and is primarily responsible for consults.</p>
<p>Consultations:</p> <p>Consults are received by the registrar with follow up consultant rounds.</p>	<p>Specialist Clinic coverage:</p> <p>Specialty clinics are routinely attended depending on unit rotation.</p>
<p>Domiciliary assessments / ACAT assessments:</p> <p>Done on request. Weekly contact with patients</p>	<p>Research/presentations:</p> <p>Close working relationship with supervisor who is a fellow of the RACP or equivalent and a member of the ANZSGM.</p>
