Dr Nick Edwards graduated MBBS from The University of Adelaide in 1990. Attained his Fellowship of the Royal Australian College of Physicians (FRACP) in 1998, and Fellowship of the Faculty of Intensive Care, Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (FFICANZCA) in 1999. He worked as a locum specialist for the Trauma Service at the RAH from 2000 and was appointed as a fulltime Staff Specialist in the ICU in March 2002. Currently divides work between Royal Adelaide Hospital ICU and Adelaide Intensive Care Services (Private). His interest are wide and varied including, being the co-developer of Disaster Medicine for Hospitals Course (SA), chemical, biological and radiological incident planning and management, teaching and Training, Australian Wines, and AFL Football (something to do with the "Crows").
